Mya Thomas (200 A) and Fisola Fagbadegun (100m) won their sprint races as did Ruby Price (800m B) and Oma Nwapa (hurdles B) while in the field Scarlett Woods (vault) also won.

The field events were the platform for the **Under 15 Boys** win, with the winning 300m track pairing of Bode Thompson and Jayden Wilkinson adding wins in the high jump and javelin respectively. Harrison Rabess had also had a win double in the discus and B shot, as Sam Thompson marked his debut by winning the A shot. Reggie Marshall (discus) and George Rogers (javelin) added more field event win.

The **Under 15 Girls** won easily as Jessica Page won both 300m and 800m and Bel Drake won both 200m and high jump, and Lila Chapelhow won the hammer and discus.
